Academic, Art, Drama, Music and Sport Scholarships are available, and Scholars receive a fee discount of 10% for Years 9, 10 and 11.

Please note that 13+ Scholarships are not available to students who already hold an 11+ Scholarship, as these also extend to the end of Year 11 and it is not possible for a student to receive more than one scholarship fee discount at any given time. Beyond Year 11, Sixth Form Scholarships are available, the assessments for which are taken in November of Year 11.

13+ ART SCHOLARSHIP

Information for Candidates

Notre Dame's Art Department is seeking scholars who have strong observational drawing skills, a creative flair and a genuine passion for the visual arts. In order to demonstrate this we would like each candidate to undertake a practical assessment, which will take place during the school day on **Monday 1st February**.

Candidates are also asked to submit a sketchbook or a portfolio of work that they have completed unaided. It is expected that you use work you have made at school as well as at home within your submission. This could include some of the following:

- 1. Drawings from direct observation, (not from pictures), some that are shaded and some using line only. They can be completed with a variety of materials such as; pencils, charcoal, fine-liner or colour pencils.
- 2. Your copies of paintings that you admire, using any materials which you feel are suitable. You can also include any other painting you have completed, or other artwork such as illustrations or designs.

Please make sure that any work submitted is clearly labelled. Submissions should be sent to Ms Basra, Head of Art, by **Friday 15th January**. These will be returned to the candidate at the end of the practical assessment.

Assessments will take place on:

Monday 1st February 2021 – 8.50am to 10.50am.

During the practical assessment you will be required to produce an observational drawing for one hour. You will also have one hour to respond to a piece of art work in colour. This will be explained in full on the day. All materials and subject matter will be provided.

13+ DRAMA SCHOLARSHIP

Information for Candidates

Each candidate should submit the following, all clearly labelled, to Miss Graham, Head of Drama, by **Friday 15**th **January 2021**:

- 1. A list of drama activities and productions in which the candidate has participated.
- 2. Any LAMDA / Guildhall / Festival comments sheets, if applicable.
- 3. A short review (no more than 300 words) of a live theatre production they have seen. This will form the basis for an informal discussion.

Candidates will also be asked to undertake a short audition, which will take place during the school day on:

Monday 1st February 2021 – 2.10pm to 4.10pm

For the audition, the candidate will need to have prepared a short monologue of no more than two minutes in length and be prepared to participate in a Drama Workshop.

13+ MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP

Information for Candidates

Auditions will take place at Notre Dame on:

the afternoon of Wednesday 27th January 2021.

Candidates will be notified of the time of their audition.

Each candidate should be prepared to:

- 1. Perform two contrasting solo pieces on her FIRST instrument
- 2. If more than one instrument, perform a solo on her SECOND instrument/voice
- 3. Undertake some simple ear tests
- 4. Sight-read (where applicable)
- 5. Candidates with suitable singing experience may choose to demonstrate their vocal ability.
- 6. Provide information as to her level of skill (grade exams, for example) and involvement in music in or out of school
- 7. Provide information as to the level of theory being studied if applicable
- 8. Provide information about her ability to compose or interest in composition if applicable

Students who require accompaniment will be asked **to submit scores for accompaniment to Ms Arthur by** Friday 8th January 2021. Students may provide their own accompanist if preferred.

If the candidate is not a vocalist, please advise if she sings in her school choir or in a choir outside school.

The voices of all instrumental candidates will be tested for tuning, quality, range and voice type using simple warm-up exercises.

As part of the audition, the Head of Music will speak to the candidate about her general interests and her involvement in school life and outside school, such as hobbies and clubs.

Those holding the award will be expected to make a strong contribution to the musical life of the school and will be encouraged to follow the Music course to GCSE. All Music scholars with suitable voices will be expected to complement their instrumental studies and participation in school orchestra with membership of one or both of the school choirs and other smaller ensembles as directed by the Head of Music.

13+ SPORTS SCHOLARSHIP

Information for Candidates

Sports Scholarships are awarded to students with a proven high level of sporting ability and potential. Candidates are expected to offer at least one sport to a high standard. Candidates must also demonstrate flair for acquiring new skills as well as a passion and commitment to sport in general.

It is expected that Sports Scholars will contribute to the sporting life of the school and engage with the Sports Scholars Programme.

Each candidate should submit a written record of her sporting achievements to Miss Paul, Director of Sport, by <u>Friday 15th January 2021</u> along with <u>photocopies</u> of awards and certificates and <u>photos</u> of any cups or medals being received. Please do not submit original certificates, awards, cups, medals, or DVD's.

The written record could include:

- 1. How long the candidate has been participating in her chosen sport or sports
- 2. School/Club/County or National participation
- 3. Courses attended, awards gained (along with awarding body/level/year achieved)
- 4. Details of positions of responsibility (eg captain)
- 5. Candidate's aspirations
- 6. Candidate's other interests, sporting or otherwise, in and out of school
- 7. Any other relevant information to support the Candidate's application

Assessments will take place on:

the morning of Thursday 28th January 2021

The scholarship assessment for internal candidates will include a 15 minute interview, which will be arranged individually with each candidate, as well as evidence from the portfolio and an analysis of the candidate's performance over the last twelve months in school sports.

The scholarship assessment for external candidates will include a 15 minute interview as well as evidence from the portfolio and an assessment of each candidate's participation in their sport, where possible. Miss Paul will contact each external candidate to arrange a date and time for the assessment and interview.
