During the celebration of St Jeanne's life and legacy the girls took part by singing exquisitely and participating in the official blessing and opening of the new Prayer Garden by Father Mervyn Williams SDB.

The Prayer Garden, named La Mothe, is named after the place in Bordeaux where St Jeanne reflected on her life; she looked back at her marriage and the joy of her children but wondered what more she could do. It was in the peace and stillness of La Mothe that St Jeanne had the inspiration to establish her own group of Sisters who would become the Company of Mary Our Lady.

This prayer garden has been made possible by the generous donations of families, friends and colleagues of the Sisters, remembering especially Sister Julia Lanaghan, Sister Margaret Curran and Sister Patricia Kelly. It is a place to remember these Sisters and all the Sisters who have lived and worked at Notre Dame as well as staff and supporters of the school who have also contributed throughout the years.

The Prayer Garden contains a statue of St Jeanne, a gift from the Sisters.


La Mothe, Bordeaux, as it is today

The team was highly commended by the panel of judges that included the President of the Royal Society of Chemistry, Professor David Phillips, Senior Lecturer of Chemistry at Imperial College, Professor Tom Welton and Professor Lord Robert Winston. The Notre Bam! Team made a presentation on polymers which involved drama, music and chemical knowledge given in a highly polished and amusing format.

Suzanne was our special guest at the 2011 Prizegiving Ceremony last September in her role as Deputy Chair of Governors and Chair of the Buildings Committee. Another member of our Alumni Association receiving an award recently was **Ruth Wilson (pupil from 1993-1998)**, who won the Olivier Best Actress Award for her title role in *Anna Christie* at the Donmar Warehouse, which has received great reviews since its opening in August of last year, starring opposite Jude Law. for the school. Sarah went on to graduate with a first class BA (Hons) degree in Fine Art in 2002 before working full time at Hampton Court Palace. Sarah then went on to study Residential Landscape Architecture (PG Dip) at the Oxford College of Garden Design in 2004.

We were delighted to hear of the culinary success of alumnae **Antonia Morosi (pupil from 2005-2010)**, who has competed in a major



2012 Regional London Heat called "Hot Chicken in 50 minutes". She won Gold - Best in Class; this means that Antonia will go onto the finals in Birmingham in February 2013. She beat 18 other students, some of whom were older and more experienced than Antonia.



Lucy still remembers being taught how to tuck in the corners of the sheets!

Lucy’s memories of the school are aided by a class photo taken in the summer of 1979, which she keeps on display wherever she is living. She writes “I think it is the combination of summer dresses sprinkled with blue flowers, green grass, sunshine and blooming wisteria behind—it is simply a lovely picture. My children enjoy

looking at it and it would be great one day to show them the exact spot it was taken”.
