Art and Textile trip to Venice.

Mrs Avizius, Mrs Howorth and Ms Fahy had the absolute pleasure to take thirty year 11, 12 and 13 Art and Textile students to Venice over the weekend. Staying in Generator Hostel on the island of Giudecca, a stone's throw away from St Mark's square, this was an ideal location to visit this beautiful city, a short Vaporetto ride away. The visit began with a guided tour of Renaissance Venice, taking in St Mark's Basilica, and Rialto Bridge. We learnt that it was not until the first half of the 5th century AD that the lagoon, due to its seclusion from the mainland Italy, started to become more and more alluring to the inhabitants of the Italian cities and villages which had to face the constant threat of the barbaric invasions. The lagoon was a wholesome refuge and, thus, as the tradition holds, the official foundation date is identified on March the 25th, 421. The name of the city comes from the ancient Veneti people who inhabited the entire present day Veneto region.

The second day was spent visiting the Venice Biennale. The Art Biennale has been recognized as the world leader in contemporary art exhibitions and the countries participating have increased from 59 (in 1999) to 86 in 2017. Nothing could have prepared us for the sheer scale of the Arsenale exhibition, it was overwhelming and incredibly awe inspiring. The 57th Venice Biennale transports you round the globe as never before, from Inuit whaling boats to Brazilian rainforests, from Korean barber shops to Iraqi minefields and Antiguan beaches.

Day three was spent initially around the market area of Rialto Bridge for a bit of shopping and then onto the world famous island of Murano with its glass factories and shops. The girls were given a demonstration of glass blowing and sculpting.

The Peggy Guggenheim Museum was the final museum we visited on day four. The core mission of the museum is to present the personal collection of Peggy Guggenheim. The collection holds major works of Cubism, Futurism, Metaphysical painting, European abstraction, avant-garde sculpture, Surrealism, and American Abstract Expressionism, by some of the greatest artists of the 20th century. Set in a beautiful location it was inspirational to see so many iconic pieces in such a small location.

The students and staff had a fabulous time; such a fantastic city and lovely people to share the experience with.

Year 13 Biology Field Trip

On Wednesday 20 September Year 13 Biologists attended Nower Wood Nature Reserve in Leatherhead for a day of fieldwork. This allowed them to carry out techniques such as sampling with quadrats and transects. They also studied succession, biotic and abiotic factors and coppicing. A study of two ponds allowed them to see the biodiversity in each pond. They carried out one of their required practicals, where they investigated the effect of environmental factors on the distribution of species.



Classical Civilisation Study Day

Nikhita K (Year 12) attended the Classical Civilisation Study Day at Cambridge University. Besides attending lectures with other Sixth Formers on Homer's Odyssey and Roman Imperial Image, Nikhita toured two colleges (King's and Clare), and the Faculty of Classics' renowned cast gallery.



Year 8 Numeracy Day at Kempton Park

Racecourse

On Monday 25th September fourteen Year 8 students attended a Numeracy Day at Kempton Park Racecourse. The girls had a behind-the-scenes tour of the racecourse including the weighing room, changing rooms, sauna and stables. We were also taken onto the racetrack itself and discovered how the photo finishes are measured. We learned about the handicapping system and the girls had to work with Imperial units such as stones, pounds and furlongs. We were taught how to interpret the complex information from the race cards and used trundle wheels to calculate the safety limits for the number of horses allowed in the parade ring.



We were also fortunate to be joined in the morning and on our tour by Adam Whitehead, the former Team GB Olympic swimmer and now Head of Learning Design with the Dame Kelly Holmes Trust. He gave us a fascinating insight into his career and how including sport in a balanced lifestyle can enhance every aspect of your well-being.

We ended the day by watching two races from our exclusive grandstand balcony and going down to congratulate the winning horses as they arrived in the winners' enclosure.

Exciting News for Years 3 and 4

At Notre Dame we believe that residential school trips are an important part of our educational provision and children's development. We have two very successful trips in Years 5 and 6 and this school year we are including Years 3 and 4 in our residential trip programme.

For Year 3 we have arranged a two day visit with one overnight stay to Hindleap Warren an outdoor centre in beautiful private woodland in West Sussex. The girls will take part in a range of outdoor activities, involving problem-solving, teambuilding challenges, bush craft and environmental education. This visit will take place on Wednesday 18th April and Thursday 19th April.

For Year 4 we have arranged a three day visit with two overnight stays at Ufton Court, an Elizabethan Manor House with extensive grounds in Berkshire. The girls will take part in creative, hands-on and interactive history activities linked to our TASK topic and a variety of environmental science and forest skills. This visit will take place from Monday 11th June to Wednesday 13th June.

Chatterbooks Book Club for Year 6




