Charity Fundraisers

This is in addition to the £1,036.25 raised for GOSH through a sponsorship page that the girls organised that has already gone to the hospital. Thank you for supporting all the initiatives of the girls throughout the year!

This week, Year 11 had the opportunity to explore the theme of iDENTITY. In an increasingly challenging age, often for teenagers dominated by social media, rates of self-harm, depression, eating disorders and esteem issues are on the rise nationally. Having the chance to discuss together in a faith context and inspired by real life stories meant hopefully the girls ended the day better equipped to be able to think for themselves, make wise choices and deal with peer pressure.

We heard from Collette Walton, a university student, about her Gap Year in Hong Kong with St Stephen's Society which provides rehabilitation homes for recovering drug addicts and gang members. It was inspirational to hear both about their work but also the step of faith she had taken in working with the charity.

The day ended with a short service in the chapel reflecting on the 'I Am' sayings of Jesus in John's Gospel and listening to verses of encouragement about what the bible says about us as people chosen, special and loved.

- Use news and current affairs to boost literacy and learning.
- Develop pupil's word power as they explore words and phrases that have been used in news stories.
- Provide probing questions encouraging pupils to dig beneath headlines of current news stories and to challenge them to develop their understanding by inferring, justifying, questioning and predicting.
- Debate real, relevant topics.

How will we use it?

Students in Years 7 - 9 will create their own intuitive logins and be able to access the iHub at school and home. Each week there will be new articles linked to comprehensions, puzzles and debates and the opportunity to earn virtual rewards (points, badges). The articles will cover many different subjects such as nature, world and home news, politics, science, sport and entertainment. 
